Driving directions

We recommend using Google Maps which will plot a good route to Carsac-de-Gurson. Enter "Carsac de Gurson, 24610". The village is small; once you get here the map and description below will help you find Chateau de Carsac.

From the North - A89, Montpon

The route from the A89 brings you through the neighbouring village of St Martin de Gurson. After St Martin, the road curves round and climbs a hill to Carsac. You'll see the church (and the back of the chateau!) on your left, the Mairie on your right. Continue past the church, and follow the road down the hill. As you get to the bottom of the hill, you'll see a large barn, just before the barn turn left into the driveway to the chateau. Follow the driveway up the hill, and bienvenue au Chateau de Carsac!

From Bergerac or St Foy le Grand

The route from Bergerac will bring you through the village of St Meard de Gurson, then along the D32, a pretty road that winds along a forested river valley. As you approach our village you'll see the ruined Chateau de Gurson ahead of you. Turn right at the crossroads signposted Carsac-de-Gurson. You'll see Chateau de Carsac and our neighbouring church on top of the hill. 50m after the crossroads, just after you pass a large barn, is the entrance to our driveway on the right. Follow the driveway up the hill, and bienvenue au Chateau de Carsac!

From Villefranche de Longchat St Emilion

Coming from St Emilion (or if you take a scenic country route from Bordeaux), you'll pass through the nearby village of Villefranche de Lonchat before approaching Carsac-de-Gurson from the West. After Villefranche you'll follow the D32, passing the entrance to the Lac de Gurson, with the ruined Chateau de Gurson on your right. Turn left at the crossroads signposted Carsac-de-Gurson. You'll see Chateau de Carsac and our neighbouring church on top of the hill ahead of you. 50m after the

crossroads, just after you pass a large barn, is the entrance to our driveway on the right. Follow the driveway up the hill, and bienvenue au Chateau de Carsac!
